1.0 NTU turbidity has been seed a guideline value because turbidity above this level has been linked to increa of probability of adverse health effects.

The Town of Lake County's source water is an unprotected body of water and at this time there is not a Waarshed Protection Plan. Because a specific source of the turbidity cannot be specified, we are unable to determine whether the make-up is organic or inorganic material. At this time, we cannot be sure that harmful pathogens are not present at levels that exceed the capacity of the chlorination to properly treat the water. Due to these reasons, Island Health is considering this an elevated risk event which requires the issuance of a Boil Water Notice."
