With the reported increase of newly confirmed COVID 19 cases, our Community is rightly raising questions and concerns regarding our ability to handle the increased number of visitors during this period that is fraught with the high risk of infection of COVID-19.

We realize that people will visit us, but we are adamant that if you are sick – Stay Home and Do not put others at risk of infection - period. If you are coming to enjoy the recreation activities provided by our waterways, remember we are not The Wild West. All Provincial applicable Laws and Regulations related to COVID-19 are also enforceable in Lake Cowichan.

The Town is working with the local RCMP to get a handle on the inappropriate activities of a few unruly visitors who are ruining the enjoyment of many visitors and residents.
